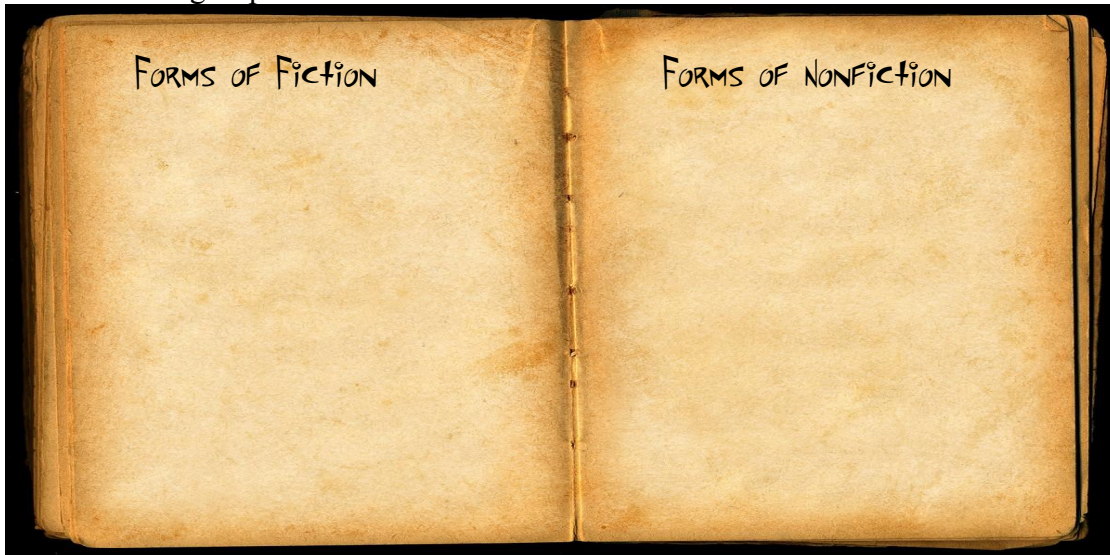

## CONCENTRATION

Study the words and definitions. When you think you know the definitions, cut along the dotted lines so you have a set of Concentration cards. I will put you in groups of four to play the game.

### Rules

1. All players mix their cards together.
2. Place the cards with the words down, on the desk (you may also play on the floor).
3. The first player turns two cards over. If the cards match (word/definition), the player collects those cards and takes another turn. If they do not match, the player turns the cards over and the next player takes a turn. Play until all the cards are gone.
4. The winner of the game is the player who has the most cards.

<b>fiction</b>	<b>Writing that tells about imaginary characters and events. Short stories and novels are an example of fiction.</b>
<b>nonfiction</b>	<b>Writing that tells about real people, places, objects, or events. Essays and articles are examples of nonfiction.</b>
<b>novel</b>	<b>A long work of fiction.</b>
<b>novella</b>	<b>A work of fiction that is longer than a short story, but shorter than a novel.</b>

<b>myth</b>	<b>A story that explains the actions of gods or heroes. They are part of the oral tradition (they are passed from generation to generation by word of mouth).</b>
<b>short story</b>	<b>A brief work of fiction.</b>
<b>article</b>	<b>A nonfiction newspaper or magazine story.</b>
<b>essay</b>	<b>A short nonfiction work about a particular subject.</b>
<b>theme</b>	<b>The insight a novel or story conveys about life.</b>
